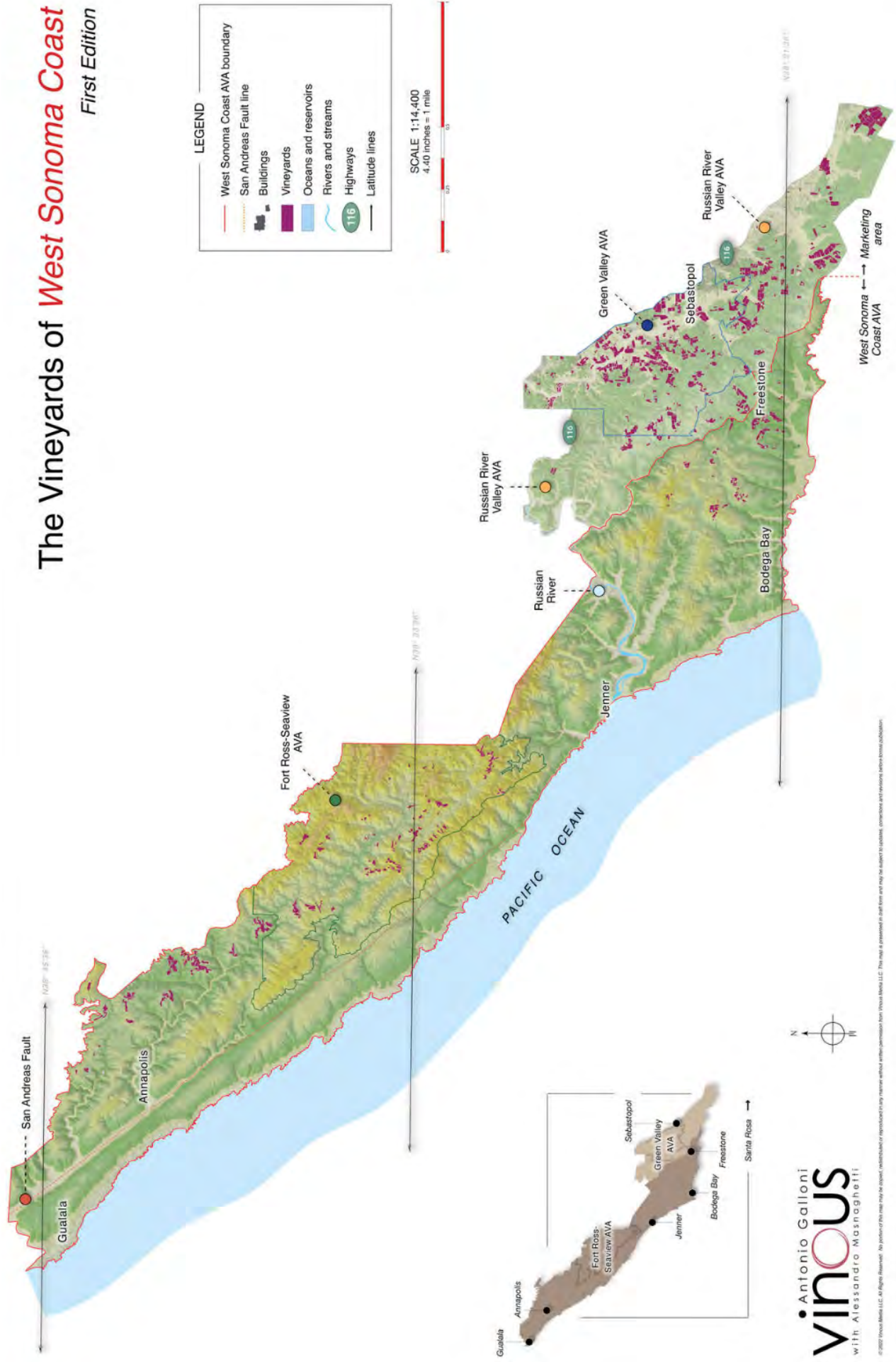
The West Sonoma Coast is one of California's most remote, rugged and diverse viticultural areas. Five winemakers from the West Sonoma Coast will take you on a guided tour of this complex and fascinating region, with a review of the geography, climate, geology and history of the West Sonoma Coast. Each winery will share examples of their wines, showcasing the unique characteristics that make this extreme coastal region so special.

The growers in the West Sonoma Coast are pushing the boundaries of what is possible in this marginal climate. Elevation of the West Sonoma Coast AVA ranges from 400 to 1,800 feet with vineyards planted on steep ridge tops along the San Andreas fault line up against the consistently cold Pacific Ocean, both above and below the fog line. As a result, temperatures are at least 10 or more degrees cooler than the rest of the Sonoma Coast AVA. Due to the immediate proximity of the Pacific Ocean, cold marine air and heavy fog create challenging conditions for grape growers, while offering distinct advantages for wine grapes. The maritime conditions moderate the temperature in the vineyards resulting in a modest diurnal temperature swing. This allows the fruit to ripen slowly throughout the day and night, a phenomenon experienced only in a truly cold-climate, maritime environment. This slow, steady ripening promotes the development of fruit that reaches true physiological maturity at lower sugar levels with pronounced acidity.

Two estate vineyards, Gloria in the Green Valley and Yu-ki in Occidental, at 1000 feet and just a few miles from the Pacific Ocean, enjoy a perfect combination of soil, climate and elevation, and are at the heart of Freeman's small lot Pinot Noir program. Akiko and her team conduct as many as 40 individual clonal fermentations each vintage to create elegant wines that are imbued with a unique Japanese sensibility. These are rare, award-winning wines treasured by fans and critics worldwide.

Senses Wines specializes in Chardonnay and Pinot noir from world class vineyards throughout the West Sonoma Coast and Russian River Valley AVAs. Founded in 2011, Senses Wines is a dream come true for three childhood friends from Occidental Christopher Strieter, Max Thieriot, and Myles Lawrence Briggs who began by farming their families' historic vineyards: B.A. Thieriot and Hillcrest. Their newest planting, Bodega Thieriot, marks three estate properties proudly farmed with Valdez & Sons. In partnership with legendary winemaker Thomas Rivers Brown, the team produces renowned single vineyard wines, of which the 2015 18 vintages received 95+ points from Robert Parker's Wine Advocate, 95, 99 points from Jeb Dunnuck in 2018, 19, and 94-97 points by Lisa Perotti Brown in 2020. Their wines are primarily sold to a loyal mailing list with specific selections allocated to wholesale partners.

WAYFARER

Nestled beyond a ridgeline towering 1,100 feet above the Pacific Ocean, Wayfarer Vineyard is an oasis in a remote landscape of redwood forests and winding mountain roads. Wayfarer Pinot Noirs and Chardonnay hail from this single estate vineyard in Fort Ross Seaview, Sonoma Coast's most dramatic appellation. Vintner Jayson Pahlmeyer purchased Wayfarer in 1998 after being introduced to it by winemaker Helen Turley. At the time, Wayfarer was an organic farm and had once been home to a small school. Renowned vineyard developer David Abreu designed the vineyard as 30 one acre blocks, each dedicated to an individual Pinot Noir or Chardonnay clone. Densely planted entirely on Goldridge soil, the vineyard is situated on east and west facing slopes ranging from 930 to 1,100 feet, just four miles from the Pacific. The vineyard was planted in 2002 but it wasn't until more than ten years later that Cleo Pahlmeyer, Jayson's daughter, introduced the first Wayfarer estate wines. Todd Kohn joined the Pahlmeyers as assistant winemaker in 2013, when Wayfarer's first vintage was in barrel. In 2017, Cleo took the helm of her family's wine business and appointed Todd Winemaker. Wayfarer thoughtfully incorporates organic and sustainable viticulture, recognizing that the highest quality fruit comes from vineyards farmed for the long term health of the land. They approach their farming vine by vine, with care and attention to detail reflected in wines that could only be from this truly special place.

SUSTAINABLE WINEGROWING PROGRAM



The Sustainable Winegrowing Program was initiated in January 2001 by winegrowing members of Wine Institute and the California Association of Winegrape Growers (CAWG) to promote vineyard and winery practices that are sensitive to the environment, responsive to the needs and interests of society-at-large, and economically feasible to implement and maintain. Wine Institute is a public policy advocacy group, representing more than 975 California wineries and affiliated businesses responsible for 85 percent of the nation's wine production. CAWG is a public policy advocacy group of winegrape growers, representing more than 60 percent of the total annual grape crush. Together they developed the Code of Sustainable Winegrowing Practices workbook as the basis for the Sustainable Winegrowing Program, providing a tool for vintners and growers to assess their practices and learn how to improve their overall sustainability. Wine Institute and CAWG formed the California Sustainable Winegrowing Alliance to assist in program implementation. These organizations will continue to work together to promote sustainable winegrowing practices that benefit the environment, the community and high quality grapes and wine.

Founded in 1996, DuMOL is a vineyard focused producer of cool-climate Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from distinctive vineyards in the coastal areas of Sonoma County. We also grow and craft small-lot Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chenin Blanc, and Mencía from exceptional vineyard sites in Sonoma and Napa using our twenty-five years of winegrowing experience. Through precise attention to detail in the vineyards and vintage-specific winemaking, we aim to bring forth wines that highlight the character of the vines themselves. Our small team is dedicated to our collection of Estate, leased, and grower-partner vineyards. DuMOL wines are released through limited allocations to our consumer mailing list and select restaurants worldwide. 15 year old vines of Mount Eden Chardonnay selection planted high density at 3,630 vines/acre. 300ft elevation east of Occidental on an east-facing hillside on Goldridge soil. Barrel fermented and aged in 30% new French oak for 11 months followed by 6 months in stainless steel. 600 cases produced.

About the Lodi American Viticultural Area (AVA)

A historic winegrowing region since the 1850s, Lodi is perfectly situated 40 miles south of Sacramento and 90 miles east of San Francisco. Lodi's Mediterranean climate and distinct soils allow its growers to cultivate 125 winegrape varieties, making Lodi the most diverse winegrowing region in the United States. Lodi is most recognized as the home of highly acclaimed Old Vine Zinfandels, with some plantings dating back to 1888. These vines, many of which are still planted on their own roots, are naturally low-yielding and consistently produce high quality wines. Although expensive to maintain, Lodi winegrowers are committed to continuing this California heritage.

The region also serves as home to 85 wineries specializing in small-lot, handmade wines that have garnered major awards at domestic and international wine competitions. Most of these wineries are multi-generational family farming operations that have been cultivating winegrapes for over 100 years. The region is California's "best kept secret" and a source of quality winegrapes for the industry's leading brands.

Lodi is naturally a leader in sustainable viticulture. Created by California farmers and accredited by world-renowned scientists, LODI RULES is America's original sustainable winegrowing program. Held to a high standard of scientific rigor and excellence, the program emphasizes environmentally and socially responsible practices, while keeping economic feasibility in mind for long-term business success. Oak Ridge Winery is a story of family, farming, and winemaking. Angelo Maggio arrived in Lodi in 1906, immigrating from the Italian coast of Genova with his wife, Louisa. The first cuttings were planted in 1928 on the property of their first ranch home, which laid the foundation for the long, winding journey that culminates in the production powerhouse that is Oak Ridge Winery. Originally built in 1934, the winery itself was once a wine-making cooperative. As multigenerational farmers, Angelo, his son Roy, and eventually his grandson Rudy, were active participants, growing grapes to supply to winemakers around the country. When the facility was placed on the market in 2002, it was Roy's son, Rudy, who saw this as an opportunity to expand on their long history of grape growing by producing quality wines of their very own. His intentions went far beyond a desire to dust off a piece of history; the Maggio family transformed it into a state-of-the-art winery capable of meeting the quality, style, and volume demands of a growing and evolving marketplace.
